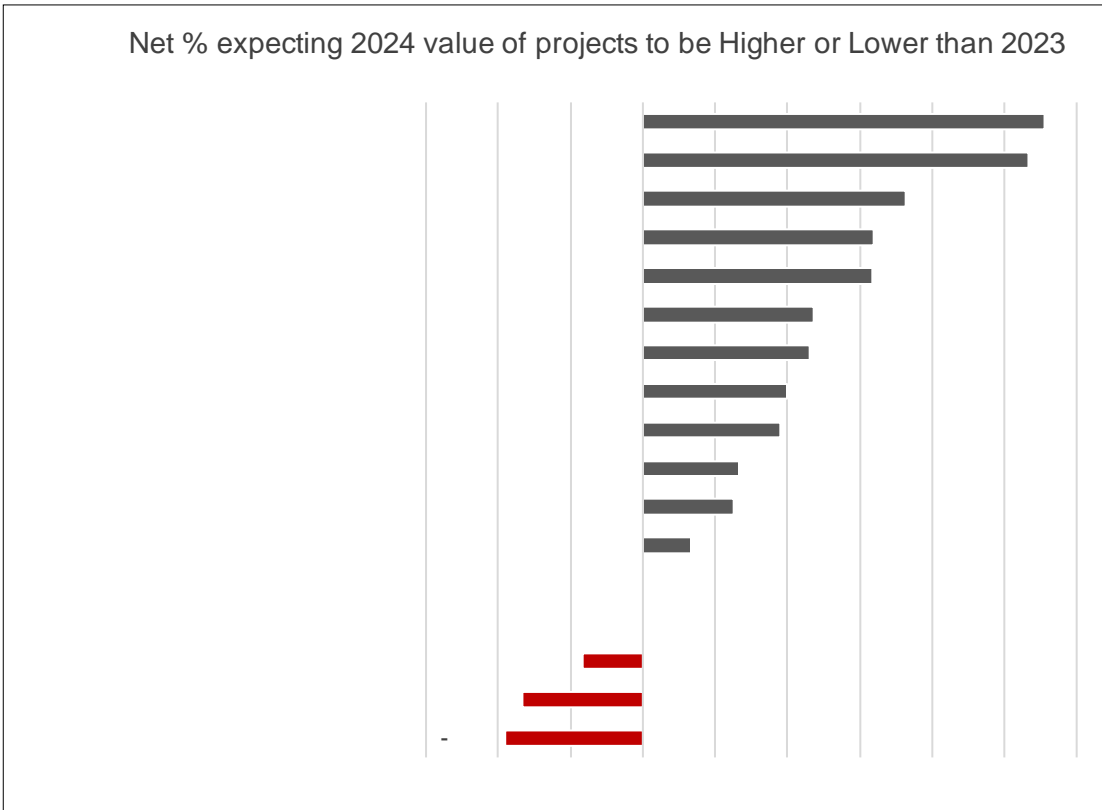




## 2024 Construction Outlook Illinois Survey Results

Total Responses: 38 Responses varied for some questions. Percentages are based on responses to each question and may not sum to 100 due to rounding.

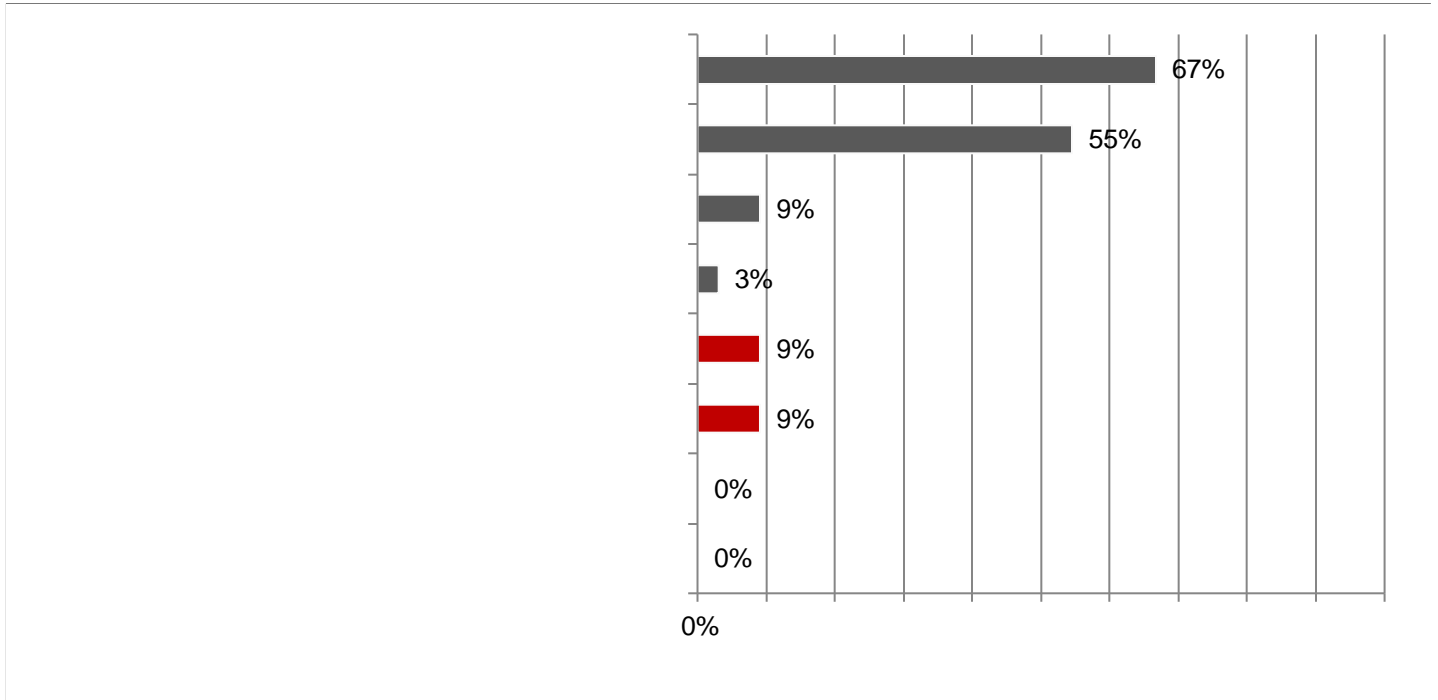
1. Compared to 2023, do you expect the available dollar value of projects you compete for in 2024 to be higher/lower/about the same (answer for all market areas in which your business operates)

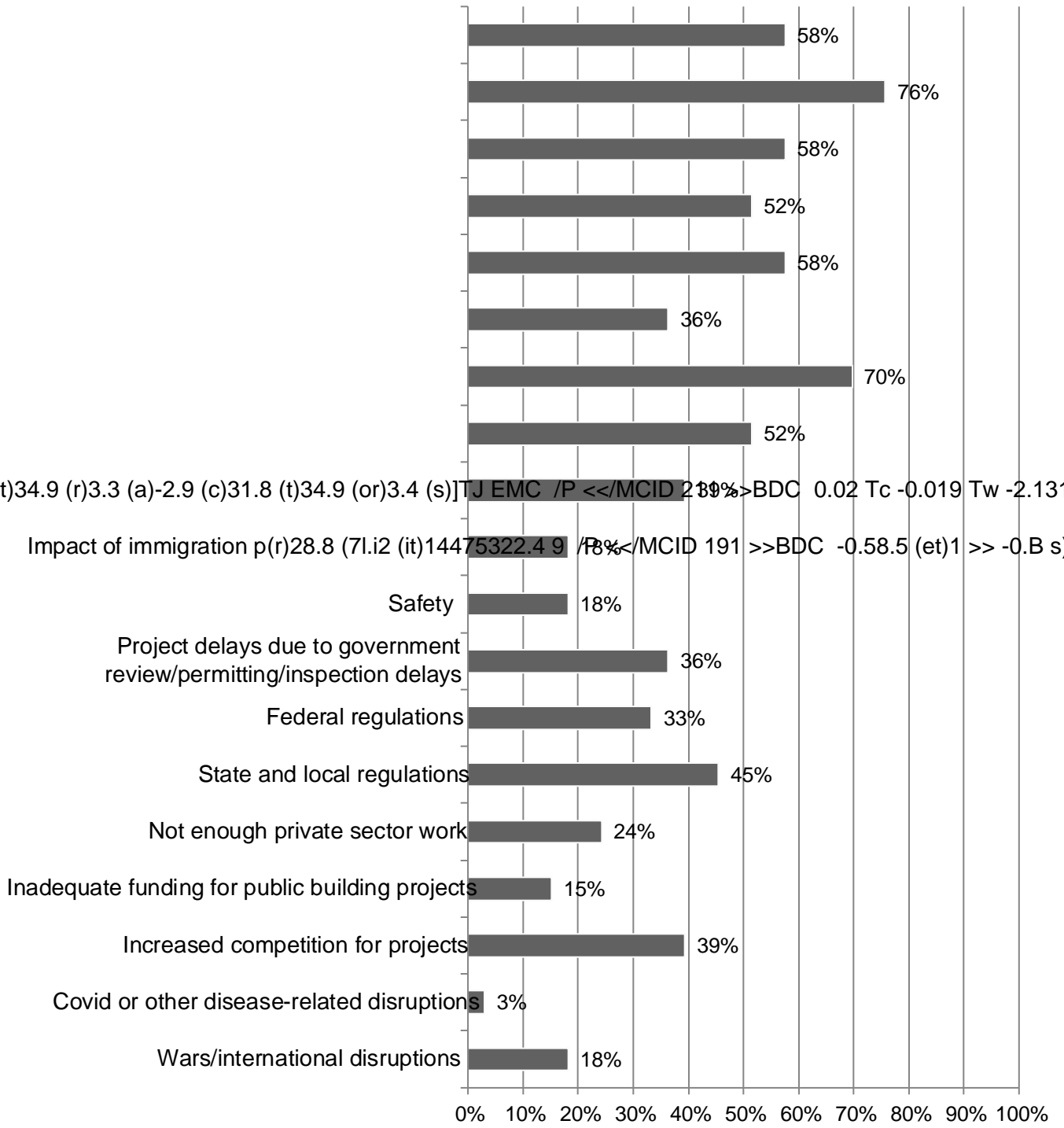

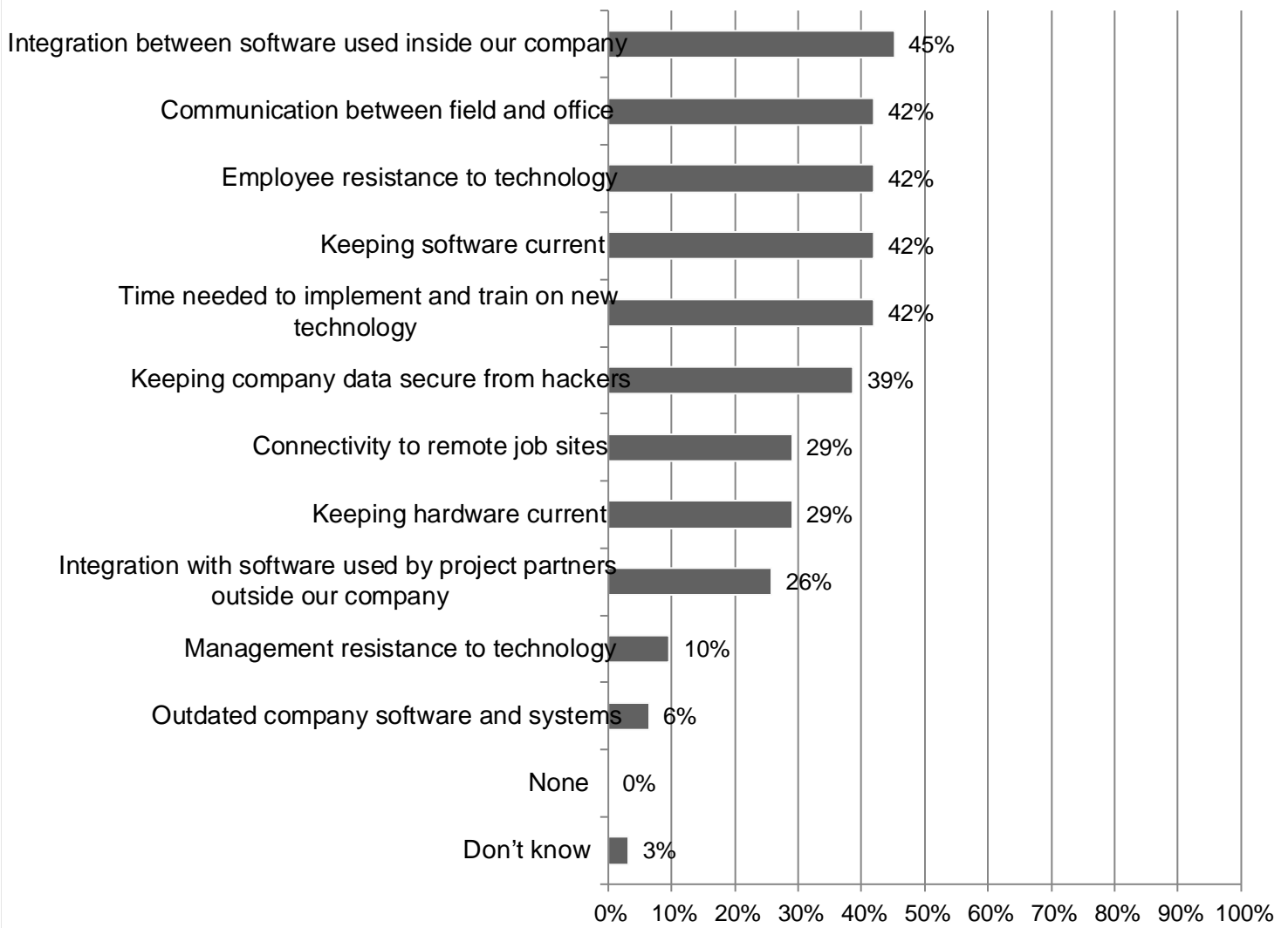
